PLAN AHEAD For Your Family!

One of the certainties in life is death and in some cases the surviving spouse (or other family member) will be left with many items to do, such as planning the funeral, notifying next of kin, etc. At some point in the process, the surviving spouse will want to notify the life insurance company of their loved one's death. However, many times, the name of the life insurance company or the amount of death benefits, etc. is not known. As the Post Service Officer, I have received calls asking if I knew if their deceased spouse had life insurance, its amount, etc. I do not have any of this type of information.

PLEASE take some time to review the following information with your spouse/family member: The name and phone number of the insurance company and the amount of the death benefit. It is best that this important information be written down and placed in a safe location where the surviving spouse/family member can find it.

Note: As a Legion member whose dues are current, you are entitled to a free accidental death policy if the circumstances of your death meet the insurance company's criteria for "accidental" death. 
