The Challenge Coin and how to "Challenge"

Challenge coins are normally presented by unit commanders in recognition of special achievement by a member of the unit. They are also exchanged in recognition of visits to an organization. The Post 374 Commander's Coin is such a coin. It is my intention to personally award each coin so that I can say my personal "thank you" to each and every volunteer who has earned one. However, I have a busy travel schedule and may ask my First Vice Commander to do the honors so that the award can be more immediate and, therefore, impacted.

The tradition of a challenge is the most common way to ensure that members are carrying their unit's coin. Everyone being challenged must immediately produce the coin for their organization and anyone failing to do so must buy a round of drinksfor the challenger and everyone else who has their challenge coin (if they were also challenged). However, should everyone challenged be able to produce their coin, the challenger must buy a round of drinks for the person/group. The rules of a challenge are:

The challenge only applies to those members that have been given a coin formally by their unit (hence, their names will be published in the newsletter). The act of challenging is called a "Coin Check" and is usually loudly announced.

The challenge, which can be made at any time, begins with the challenger drawing his/her coin, and slapping or placing the coin on the table or bar. In noisy environments, continuously rapping the challenge coin on a surface may initiate the challenge. (Accidentally dropping a challenge coin is considered to be a deliberate challenge to all present.)

While most holders of challenge coins usually carry them in their pockets or in some other readily accessible place on their persons, a challenged person is allowed "a step and a reach" to get their coin (for example, if the coin is in their purse or coat pocket), or if an individual has an extra coin to pass it off to the person closest to them.
